GO KART SPECIFICATIONS

- 1. Your Go Kart must be single seated with the drive looking forward in an upright position. The Driver must be able to get in and out of the Go Kart easily and operate steering in the normal seated position without stretching or straining.
- 2. Your Go Kart must be powered by gravity and your Kart Pusher only. Go Karts must be non-motorised and non-pedal powered.
- 3. Your Go Kart must be able to break without the pusher.
- 4. Minimum of four wheels must be on the Go Kart. Measures must be taken to prevent wheels from departing the Go Kart when in use. Use cotter pins or other positive means to keep the wheels in place.
- 5. Your Go Kart must have steering capabilities and be fastened appropriately to prevent any loosening when in use.
- 6. Your Go Kart can be made of any material. However, there shall be no exposed sharp edges or points. Exposed edges that may be contacted by the driver shall be smooth. Protective cushioning material may also be fitted.
- 7. Your Go Kart cannot be any larger than:
 Maximum overall length 1300mm
 Maximum overall width 610mm
 Max diameter of wheels 210mm
- 8. To enter the competition, you must have a Driver and a Kart Pusher in the same race class category and they must wear helmets and protective clothing in all heats.
- 9. All basic structure parts must be securely fastened to each other using bolts, screws or other suitable hardware. Plywood and solid wood are permitted structural materials. The basic structure is defined as the chassis on which the driver sits and to which the axles, steering and brake mechanisms, and body shell are attached. The car body or shell may part of the basic structure. It must be made of rigid impact resistant material.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

- 1. Each Go Kart must pass scrutineering by the organisers of the event. Carts deemed unsafe will not be permitted.
- 2. All entrants must wear approved safety equipment, including an Australian Standards Approved pushbike or motorbike helmet. Adequate eye protection is recommended.
- 3. Only the nominated Driver and the Kart Pusher are allowed in the pit area at the time of their race. Other people will be asked to leave the area for their own safety and the safety of others.
- 4. No weaving or turning is allowed during the race.
- 5. Brakes must be used to stop after crossing the finish line.
- 6. If the Go Kart crashes and is damaged, the closest track marshal will assess whether the cart can continue down the track. The decision of the marshal will be final. If the Go Kart cannot continue, the marshal will assist in clearing it from the track. The Go Kart cannot race again until it has being given clearance by a scrutineer.
- 7. When the cart crosses the finish line, they will be waived through with a chequered flag.
- 8. All entrants must follow any instructions given by the Event Officials or Emergency Services during the course of the event.



RACE FORMAT

Registration and Scrutineering

- Registrations and scrutineering is located in the car park in Oak Street
- 2. All Go Karts, Drivers and Kart Pushers must attend for scrutineering between 5.30pm 6.30pm on Friday 4 May 2018. All drivers are strongly urged to attend the scrutineering area as early as possible to avoid last minute queue resulting in missing your event.

Heats and scoring

1. The scoring system is as follows:

1st = 100 points

 $2^{nd} = 75 \text{ points}$

 $3^{rd} = 50 \text{ points}$

4th = 25 points

- 2. First, Second or Third place getters in each age heat proceed to the finals based on the overall score.
- 3. Total drivers score will determine their pole position in the finals. The driver with the fastest overall times will choose their pole position. Then second and third.
- 4. In the situation of a tie, in regards to pole position. The Event Organisers will toss a coin. The winner of the coin toss will be allocated the better pole position.
- 5. The finish marshals will determine the carts across the line.
- 6. In the event of a tie, where one or more of the drivers (first, second or third) receive equal highest number of points, then four carts will race in the final.
- 7. The finish marshals decision is final.
- 8. All event officials and judge's decisions will be final. No appeals or correspondence will be entered into.

Race format

- 1. Racing commences at 6.30pm.
- 2. Entrants are organised into age classes with heats raced first in the following order:
 - Primary Junior Class
 - High School Junior Class
 - Open Class (18 years and over)
 - Finals
- 3. Winners of each final will be presented with their prize after all races have been held. Winners of each age category will receive \$50.00 voucher each for the Driver and Kart Pusher. Second place each age category will receive \$30.00 voucher each for the Driver and Kart Pusher. Third place each age category will receive \$20.00 voucher each for the Driver and Kart Pusher.
